## **Community Workshops**

#### What Happens After PUF?

Entering the school system after receiving Program Unit Funding can look different for each child. This workshop provides information on common school options for children with ASD and the levels of support provided, and also explores some strategies to help families and schools with transitions into new programs, new schools, new classrooms, etc.

#### **Exploring Challenges with Toileting for Children with ASD**

Toilet training can be challenging for many families, and there are additional factors to consider for children with ASD. This workshop aims to explore toilet training by discussing common challenges that parents might encounter and provides strategies to support with this complex routine.

#### Tell Me More: Moving Beyond Requesting for Children with ASD

In this session you will learn strategies for increasing the language skills of children who are talking using echolalia, single words, or sentences. We will discuss how to facilitate development of their vocabulary, comprehension and sentence structure skills, as well as how to increase their social and functional use of language.

#### **Facilitating Play Dates with Peers**

Many children with ASD struggle in social situations with their peers. In this session, you will learn about stages of social play skills. We will discuss effective strategies for parents or other supporting adults to use with kids at each stage of development. We will also share guidelines that are helpful in planning play dates, setting our kids up for success as they learn to make and maintain friendships.

#### Facilitating Sibling Relationships, and Making Time for Siblings

Having a child with special needs often impacts the time and energy that parents have for their other children, which can sometimes lead to difficulties in parent-child relationships, as well as difficulties within sibling relationships. This workshop will provide strategies for facilitating healthy and positive sibling interactions, and ways to make more time for siblings who have a brother or sister with special needs. The content will focus on the wellness of siblings, how to talk to a sibling about the needs of their brother or sister, as well as other parenting considerations, strategies, and resources.

#### **Siblings Support Group and Networking**

Having a sibling with special needs is a very different and unique experience. This workshop will provide siblings an opportunity to connect with their peers, share their successes and challenges, learn new information, ask questions, and most importantly, have fun! #### Tips and Tricks to Help Slow Down and Manage Anxiety

Many children with ASD experience anxiety. Children who are not able to effectively communicate their anxiety may resort to other challenging behaviours. This workshop explores resources to support children to understand their own anxiety, and will discuss strategies that parents or other professionals can implement on a daily basis to help reduce anxiety.

### Bike Riding 101

The goal of this workshop is to get families and children ready for the outdoor bike riding season. We will also be teaching basic bike maintenance skills such as pumping tires, cleaning and lubricating chain, ensuring breaks work etc. Parent participation is required. # **Sharing Your Child's Diagnosis and How Others Can Support Your Child**

Receiving a diagnosis of Autism Spectrum Disorder can be scary for families. Who should you tell? When should you tell them? What information do caregivers and other people supporting the child need? Even someone who has experience with autism may not approach the child in the way you'd like them to, so how do you go about teaching someone about your child and how to best support them? This workshop discusses strategies to support these challenging conversations with others, and also strategies for training and preparing someone to care for your child, for example, other family members or people in the community (e.g. school bus driver).

#### **TalkAbility**

The early years are especially crucial for verbal children on the autism spectrum because they still face special communication challenges. Often, these children find it difficult to: have conversations with others, play with children their own age, talk about things that interest someone else, or change a routine without become frustrated.

This parent course is specifically designed for parents of verbal children ages 3-7 years with practical social communication difficulties.

#### Triple P

Stepping Stones Triple P (Positive Parenting Program) is similar to other Triple P programs, but includes adaptations for children who have a disability. This parent course helps parents build their skill sets to manage challenging behaviours in a way that meets the developmental level of the child. Parents will learn and practice implementing strategies that will work for their family, and create a 'toolbox' of strategies to help them tackle the tough times at home.

#### **Social Games**

Basic social play will be learned and practiced during this 6-week group. We will practice sharing, turn-taking and communicating while playing games. Video modeling and role play will be used to demonstrate how to interact with each other. Facilitators will include members of the speech-language pathology team.

This session is geared toward children aged 5-9 years old who are able to express their needs but need support with peer interaction. This group is for a maximum of 6 participants.

A parent training component will be included. Parents will learn how to:

- Support their child's participation in social games (e.g. tag, duck-duck-goose)
- Help their child practice skills related to peer interaction waiting, playing by the rules, inviting others to play, etc.
- Support playdates with peers

Parents will also provide mutual support by sharing their experiences, both challenges and successes, with each other.

Parent participation is required.
