Summer Support Workers

Children's Autism Services of Edmonton is currently recruiting Summer Support Workers to assist in the creation and provision of a unique set of experiences for children with autism and other developmental delays.

As a Summer Support Worker you will be supporting children in a number of different activities, these activities may be held at the Maier Centre West, Maier Center South, community settings, or at client's homes. Summer programming is a way for children with special needs to come together or spend time 1 on 1 in a supported setting to experience an engaging environment and explore new things and places.

Key Responsibilities:

- Provide care and supervision according to the individual child's needs
- Work in a child focused, family centered, supportive environment
- Provide learning opportunities and behavioural support
- Ensure safety of all individuals in all settings

Required Qualifications:

- Applicants must be between 17 and 30 years of age at the start of the employment
- Applicants must have a Police Record Check. Child Intervention Check and First Aid & level-C CPR
- Applicants must be dedicated to children, committed to learning new skills, and interested in making a difference!
- Applicants must be a Canadian citizen, permanent resident, or person to whom refugee protection has been conferred under the Immigration and Refugee Protection Act for the duration of the employment
- Applicants must have a valid Social Insurance Number at the start of employment and be legally entitled to work in Canada
