Key Responsibilities:

- Provide care and supervision according to the individual child's needs
- Work in a child focused, family centered, supportive environment
- Provide learning opportunities and behavioural support
- Ensure safety of all individuals in all settings
- Provide additional personal care supports depending on the child
- Engage in play, social supports, and other scheduled activities directly with each child

Required Qualifications:

- Applicants must have a Police Record Check. Child Intervention Check and Intermediate First Aid & level-C CPR 9
- Applicants must be dedicated to children, committed to learning new skills, and interested in making a difference!
