- Develop, implement and monitor classroom activities to meet the needs of individual students
- Develop/review Individual Program Plans (IPP) in collaboration with parents/consultants and participate in IPP meetings
- Document progress of children (IPP goals) and ensure children's records are maintained
- Participate in professional growth opportunities
- Work collaboratively on a team of professionals which may include speech and language pathologists, occupational therapists, behavior consultants and psychologists
- incorporate recommendations and strategies provided by consultants into classroom activities and daily routines and provide feedback on the recommendations
- supervise and coach classroom educational assistants
